

## <u>Whitgreave Primary School</u> <u>Sports Premium Expenditure Report - 2024/2025</u>

Sports Premium Funding is money that is provided by central government to improve the quality of Sport and PE in Primary Schools. Each year the school receives a lump sum per eligible pupil, which equates to a total of £19,600 for Whitgreave Primary School for 2024/2025.

This document outlines the proposed plan for spending the allocated funding in 2024/2025, along with impact statements.

## **Swimming Provision**

Swimming and water safety is an important part of the PE Curriculum at Whitgreave Primary School and another way of helping pupils to lead healthy and active lives.

During the academic year, pupils within Year 6 attend swimming lessons once a week, during the Autumn Term and Spring Term. In line with the requirement set out in the National Curriculum, pupils are grouped according to their ability and are taught to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, using a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situation.

## Next Steps/Actions, as a result of the 2023/24 Data:

- Continue top-up funding for Minibus purchase to ensure Year 3 Year 6 have the opportunity to swim.
- Utilise top-up funding for Swimming for 3 terms, instead of 2.
- Utilise smaller groups sizes 15 pupils maximum, instead of 30 across 3 teachers.
- Additional sessions per week as opposed to 1 session, on days not effected by school events.

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
